New Mexico 4-H Sheep Production and Management Project

Objective: To teach 4-Hers about selection and breeding, management, nutrition, reproduction, and health of breeding sheep. Through active involvement in this project participants will gain the skills necessary to begin and improve a sheep flock.

What do I do with my breeding sheep project materials and information?

SUGGESTED STEPS FOR COMPLETING THE SHEEP PROJECT WITH SUCCESS

- Review the project packet, record sheet, and Greentop to become familiar with the project before the first project meeting.
- Attend all sheep project meetings to learn more about your project.
- Attend all workshops and programs that involve sheep.
- Participate in all county, regional, and state fairs.
- For completion of the project, complete the record sheet and turn in a county record book to your local Extension Agent. (Throughout your project, check the boxes if you complete a listed item. This will help you when you fill out your record book.)

SUGGESTED LEARNING ACTIVITIES

- Visit feed mill, feedlot, packing house, and sheep auction.
- Visit a sheep nutritionist to learn about properly feeding sheep.
- Go to meat retail outlet and identify cuts of meat.
- Visit local sheep producers.
- Contact NM Wool Grower's about promoting sheep.
- Participate in clinics and workshops about sheep.

What can be done?

- Give demonstrations or illustrated talks on the various components of the sheep project.
- Conduct a grooming and showmanship workshop for less experienced members.
- Exhibit animals at jackpots, county fairs, state fairs, and national stock shows.
- Help other 4-Hers prepare a sheep demonstration.
- Assist with livestock shows or sales.
- Perform community service and citizenship activities such as:
 - Present an educational program on sheep to the local grade schools.
 - Assist with Agriculture in the Classroom program.
