Objective Statement: this project will assist the 4-Her in building on leadership skills learned in project I and II and build on skills needed for working with and in groups.

What will be learned? To learn leadership, you will need skills in each of seven different areas.

- **Introduction Understanding self** developing a positive attitude about who you are, what you like and don't like, and what you want to be.
- **Communicating** through effectively sharing information by writing, listening, and speaking.
- **Getting along with others** how you relate to other people – in a group or one on one, and how you accept and appreciate people that are different from you.
- **Learning to learn** understanding the attitudes and techniques needed to learn and how you can be a positive force in your own life.
- **Making decisions** by learning how to set and accomplish goals, solving problems and taking action as a group or individual.
- **Managing** by choosing and using the things available to get what you want – reaching your goals.
- **Working with groups** by learning how groups work together to accomplish their goals.

What can be done (county, district, state, etc.):

- Take a leadership role and consider running for a County Council or State Office.
- Offer to write up something about 4-H events in the county for the newsletter or local paper (Maybe an article about Senior Leadership Retreat or State Conference for local paper).
- Take a leadership role in your county awards program – be part of the planning or help set up.
- Give speeches to local groups about 4-H (Elk's Lodge, Lion's, Knights of Columbus, and other similar groups).
